Introducing "IB-Green"

Newsletter #1 - December 2023

After more than a year of development and planing, the Interreg North-West Europe project, "IB-Green: Industrial and business parks - climate resilient and fit for future" officially started in March 2023. With this first newsletter, our main aim is to introduce the project and showcase some of the first project activities.

With 11 project partners from 6 countries, IB-Green aims at transforming existing industrial and business park into climate resilient ones by creating green and blue infrastructure. The project focuses on industrial and business parks built between 1950 and 2000, which are particularly vulnerable to heat stress because they are highly sealed. The objective of IB-Green is to redevelop these industrial and business parks by implementing climate adaptation measures, e.g. unsealed parking lots, construction of greenways or green roofs and rain management infrastructure. IB-Green wants to provide best-practice examples or training courses to relevant stakeholders, such as planners and decision makers of local authorities and companies.

IB-Green is an Interreg North-West Europe Project (EU funding 5,4 million Euro, total budget 8,9 million Euro), with a timeline from 2023 - 2027. IB Greens project partners represent local

authorities, business park operators, networks, sector organisations and science institutions from Germany, Netherlands, France, Ireland, Belgium and Luxemburg.
